### OVERVIEW:

The 5 month-long Marawi siege, considered to be the longest urban battle in the modern history of the Philippines, greatly affected the Provinces of Lanao del Sur and Lanao del Norte. As a result, the livelihoods of over 64,000 displaced families were damaged, and the displaced children ages 6-59 months, pregnant women, and lactating mothers suffered from acute malnutrition and other nutrition and health problems.

Although the war has already ended, the affected families continue to struggle in their livelihood because many of them are still living in evacuation centers. With much of the city destroyed, displaced young children, pregnant and lactating women in the crisis affected areas are seen to be nutritionally at risk.

## KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

**1,425** Pregnant and Nursing Women (PNW) were provided with medium quantity lipid-based nutrition supplements.

**6.8** Metric Tons of Nutrition Supplements were distributed to both the Targeted Pregnant and Nursing Women (PNW)

**7,635** Children were provided with lipid-based nutrition supplement and had their weight, height, and nutritional status monitored monthly.

**24.2** Metric Tons of Nutrition Supplements were distributed to both the Targeted and the Blanket Supplementary Feeding Programs for the Children

**758** Health Workers were given orientation and refresher courses on acute management and prevention.

### OBJECTIVE OF THE PROJECT:

To provide technical and operational support to the local health facility staff (City/Health Unit and Barangay Health Stations/Centers) in the implementation of a five-month Blanket and Targeted Supplementary Feeding Programs (B/TSFP) contributing to the improvement of the nutritional status of nutritionally at risk displaced young children, pregnant and lactating women (PLWs) including adolescent girls in the crisis-affected areas in Marawi and Lanao del Sur.

2. Conduct of regular nutrition education, health and hygiene promotion and provision of key IYCF to caregivers
3. Registration and monthly monitoring of children's weight and height and nutritional status



## Output 3:

1. Orientation and refresher course for the health workers on acute management and prevention program
2. Provision of programme materials (IEC)
3. Establishment of beneficiary feedback mechanism
4. Conduct of refresher course on Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF) counselling, hygiene and sanitation promotion to health workers
5. Conduct of activity and post-distribution monitoring
