Typhoon Mangkhut (local name: Ompong) ravaged 7 regions in the Philippines

- Rapid multi-sectoral assessments conducted by ADRA and HI in Itogon and Pinukpuk revealed that there is a general absence of both mainstream NGOs and sector specific organizations of women, persons with disabilities, farmers, youth, persons with disabilities and older persons days and weeks after the disaster.
- CSOs and CBOs interviewed said that they have limited capacity to engage in local governance due to lack of knowledge and skills on risk and climate governance, planning and budgeting.

Nevertheless, CSOs have the right and responsibility to voice out the collective needs and promote the rights of the people, and hold government institutions accountable.



EMPOWER believes that through meaningful participation of CSOs in disaster and climate risk governance, communities become more resilient and their vulnerability is reduced.

EMPOWER Project's overall objective is to strengthen the resilience of high-risk communities by reinforcing civil society relevance in disaster and climate risk governance


Outcome


